Music and Movement Zone

Variety of musical instruments
Music listening station with headphones
Scarves and ribbons for movement
Simple recording device for compositions
Song cards with pictures and words
Cultural music from around the world
Space for dancing and movement
Rhythm sticks and shakers easily accessed



Role Play Area

Home corner set up with real-life props
Dressing up clothes for various roles
Theme-based role play (shop, hospital, etc.)
Writing materials in role play contexts
Cultural clothing and accessories
Male and female role representation
Mirrors and props for self-expression
Links to current learning topics

Clear labels with pictures and words
Flexible furniture that can be moved easily
Technology integrated meaningfully

Observation clipboards prepared
Camera accessible for capturing learning
Learning journey folders/books ready
Next steps tracking system in place
Target children identified for focused observations
Assessment criteria clearly understood
Parents informed about assessment processes
Evidence collection systems organised
